Flavour Discovery: Fall Beers



As the seasons have changed from summer to fall, so have people's beer preferences! Trading out our lineup of summer beers, we now cozy up to some of our fall favourites.

1) Triple IPA

Many think that IPAs are only for summer, but this beer style is versatile. It ranges from golden to amber in colour, and from fruity to spicy in flavour. IPAs are a great beer anytime of the year.

2) Belgian Winter Ale

This beer has a unique colour, a full body, and it can warm up the drinker from the inside out. Winter ales have flavours such as nutmeg, cloves, and caramel.

3) Stout

A stout is the quintessential cold weather beer; with the heavy malt tones and flavours like coffee and chocolate, it's a sure winner.

4) Red Ale

With its colour mimicking the leaves, red ales are a great fall beer with a malt profile and variability in its bitterness.

From Barrel to Bacchus: Wines To Try for Fall

Not only does beer have seasonally appropriate styles, but so does wine! Here are some wine styles to give a go this fall.

1) Semillon

A full-bodied white wines that pairs great with dark green fall vegetables. You can expect notes of honey and almond.

2) Carignan

This is a medium-bodied red wine with flavours such as cranberry, cured meat, and baking spice.

3) Grenache

This is a quintessential fall wine, with its character varying depending on the region. You can get raspberry and clove (Spain and Australia) or dried strawberry and herbs (France and Italy).
